WHY RECITE THE LONG CREED?

The Nicene Creed has quite a history and has come about because of the Arian Heresy that prevailed quite prominently during the 4th Century particularly in the Mediterranean region. The belief of Arianism was that the Son of God was created by God, therefore a creature, and inevitably a subordinate to God. This heresy, therefore, rejected the Divinity of Christ, the Mystery of the Most Holy Trinity and the Mystery of the Incarnation.

Through the great work of St Athanasius and the members of the Council of Nicea in 325AD and the Council of Constantinople 381AD a statement of truth was set in stone, that Jesus, is Light from Light, True God from True God, Consubstantial with the Father (i.e. of One Substance, or One Being), incarnate of the Virgin Mary through the power of the Holy Spirit.

I believe it was the foresight of the Church to keep the Nicene Creed always in the forefront of the minds and hearts of the faithful so that other beliefs and philosophies of any time, about Jesus, The Christ, will not infiltrate or mislead the faithful.

The Nicene Creed, properly known as the Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed is a Profession of Faith and the only time it can be replaced according to the Order of the Mass is during Lent and Easter Time when the Apostolic Creed can be recited, which is related more to the Baptismal Promises.

Comparing the two Creeds I would say that the Nicene has basically a paragraph more on the Divinity of Christ (2nd Paragraph) and more on the Holy Spirit (2nd Last Paragraph) the rest, apart from extra words is essentially the same. But, it is the extra paragraphs and extra words in the Nicene Creed that gives it the extra depth so that the faithful will remain steadfast in their knowledge of Christ the Lord & the Most Holy Trinity.
