REFLECTION

'THIS IS MY BODY.'

During the Passover meal the Jewish people remembered God's saving deeds in the past. In this act of remembering, God's saving power is experienced in the present. Through the ritual meal of the last supper Jesus points to a future event, his crucifixion, in which his body will be broken and his blood shed to inaugurate a new covenant between God and humankind. In the Eucharist we remember Christ's saving action and participate in its fruits.

Plenary Council - Our Parish Launch

This weekend with the whole of the Perth Diocese we launch our Parish Plenary Council. We will light the special Plenary Council Candle distributed at last week's St Mary's Cathedral Vigil Mass and received by Steven Yovich who is the Plenary Council Coordinator of this Parish. Greatly appreciated Steven.

At this Mass and every weekend the Candle will be lit to remind us to reflect on the question: ***"What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?"***

Pope Francis has approved Australia's Bishops holding a Plenary Council in 2020 and 2021. It is a significant moment for the Church in Australia to make decisions about the future. Archbishop Costelloe has been appointed President of the Plenary Council by Pope Francis and as Chairman of the Bishops' Commission on the Plenary.

In the coming months, as a parish community, we will gather to listen to one another, to reflect on this question and share our own stories of faith, and our experiences of the Church. Then, we will collate our stories, ideas and questions about the future of the Church in Australia and upload our submissions through the Plenary Council webpage.
